BLAST from the PAST: Chapter project, the PU-2


I ran across this picture from 1989, my daughter Susan on the right, under the 'wing' of the PU-2. I have often mentioned the PU-2 to newer chapter members and board members and when I found this picture, I figured I had to publish it.

The PU-2 was a chapter designed and built, porta john used for the chapter picnics. EAA chapter 45 picnics for about 40+ years were held actually off the airport property but adjacent to it. There was a low hill with a flat top that was in the vicinity of the car gate near the restaurant. It extended from about where the first factory building is now on the right side of the entrance driveway, all the way up to about where the first hangar is when you enter that car gate. It gave a great view of the runway and allowed a perfect grandstand to buzz-jobs back in the day. There was an early airport member who owned that property and would only allow Chapter 45 to use it for our picnics, otherwise it was a wooded area that we slowly over the years carved out a nice, wooded and shaded flat picnic spot. I sure miss it.

Back to the PU-2, utilizing composite construction (we used anything available no matter what material we could find as long as it was free) and was very brightly painted, mimicking our Chapter colors also seen on the Chapter Volksplane project.. The main construction was wood and was only a one-holer but it did have a short section of aluminum house gutter inside along the wall, where men could use it just for #1, hence, it was labeled, 'Runway No. 1" and the main hole was labeled, 'Runway No. 2'. During the Saturday picnic work party, we would carry it out to the picnic site from the hangar and after a very nice square hole was dug (different spot every year!), the PU-2 was positioned on top of the spot. Since it was the only bathroom on the airport, it got a lot of use!



Let me point out some other interesting details. Notice that while there are two wings, also note there is a tail assembly, complete with red and white striped rudder. Below is a close up view of the door.



The carved wooden prop has a coffee can for a spinner and the door handle is fashioned into a faux machine gun. See the ammo belt painted on and also the engine cylinders. So what happened to the PU-2?

Eventually we decided to try to leave it outside as we ran out of room in the hangar to store it. After two seasons, it was so dilapidated, it was disassembled.
