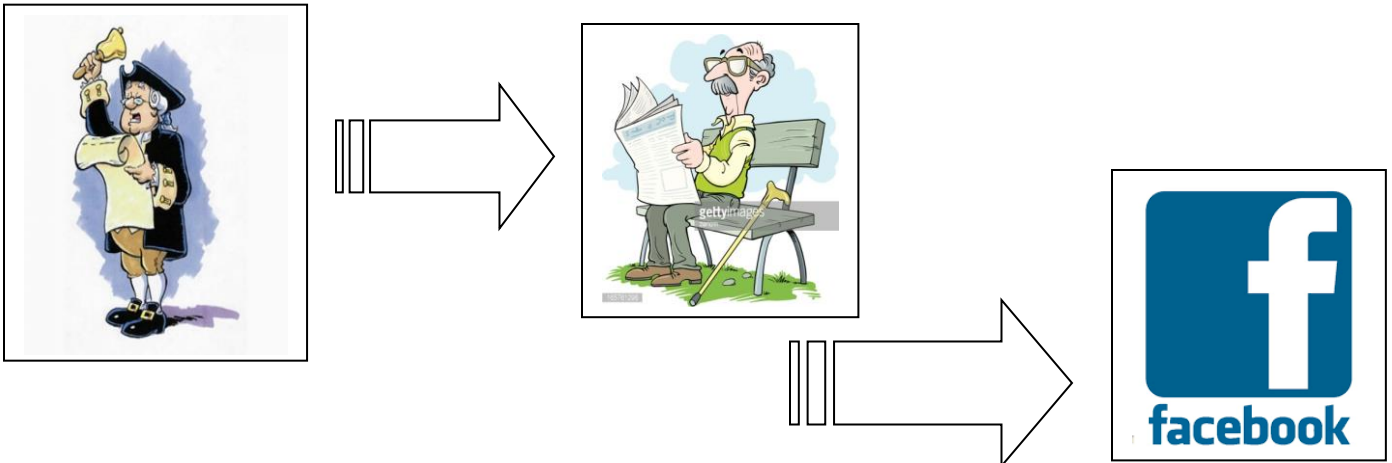
I recently found that a Kidde fire extinguisher in our chapter hangar was part of the safety recall put out last November by Kidde. It seems that fire extinguishers manufactured by them during a period of at least ten years are prone to not working or exploding when used. Some units with a plastic handle and plastic valving are apparently defective and they will replace your Kidde or private branded extinguisher (such as many Sears brand units) for FREE. Search for Kidde Fire Extinguisher Recall or use this link

The web site is excellent at explaining which units are recalled and the process for getting a new one Free from them. They even send a post paid box to send the old unit back so you don't have to try to dispose of it.

Note, First Alert extinguishers are not made by Kidde.

Sign up is easy and FREE... Just go to www.facebook.com and click on 'First Name' and then fill in the blanks, then click the button Create Account.

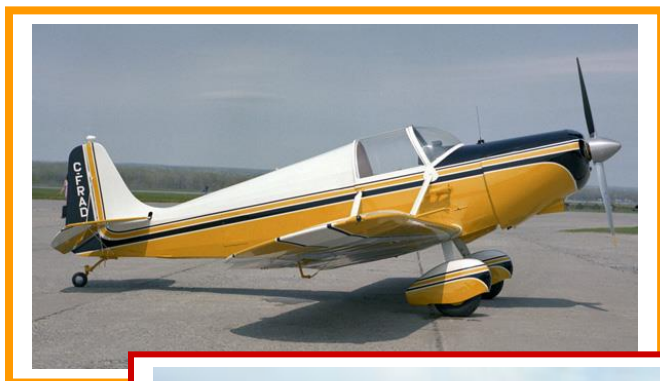
