Shop Tip # 78 by Jack Dernorsek

So you need more organized storage and you decide to buy some inexpensive metal shelving. For all their light tin-work on these shelves, they are fairly sturdy for light items when assembled. But I have done two modifications to not only improve their capability but also to make them more useful.

One idea is to turn one or two or more shelves upside down during assembly....What? Upside down? Yes, because this adds a rim around the perimeter that keeps things from slipping off when you are loading or unloading items from the shelf. I usually do not turn them all over because a down side of this idea is that only items that will fit neatly on the shelf will work. i.e. items are prevented from hanging over the edge. One other advantage of this idea is that the shelves turned over have a nice edge around that offers a flange to add cardboard or plywood sides to box in a particular shelf if you want to hide or protect items further.

The second idea that I do from the beginning is to add additional diagonal supports. Typically they now supply four diagonal members, one for each side and two for the back. Adding at least four more made from strips of wood add to the weight capability and also sturdy the frame work preventing future loosening of fasteners which leads to unwanted flexibility of the shelving.
