


#### IN MEMORIAM Francis Barch



## THE MON-VALLEY R/C CLUB

WESTMORELAND COUNTY PARK COMMISSION SETS NATIONAL PRECEDENT AS PENNSYLVANIA R/C CLUB BECOMES FIRST IN NATION TO OBTAIN FLYING SITE UNDER FEDERAL "PROJECT 70."

This article is written in behalf of the thousands of radio control modelers who may be experiencing the problems of locating a suitable flying site. If this problem confronts your club, read on, and discover how the MON-VALLEY RADIO CONTROL CLUB conquered this problem and, through its efforts, may well have "paved the way" for future developments on flying site locations.

Before uncovering the solution to this somewhat archaic problem, a brief club history is interjected so the reader may visualize the inception and growth of an organization from its modest beginning to the present form.

In the late '40's' control line flying captured the interests of local modelers throughout the valley. Through the dedication and efforts of Sam and Jack Poole, Michael Nogy, Francis Maguire, Wilfred Taylor, Steve Miller, and William Pocky, a club was born. Throughout the years, interest and enthusiasm for model flying remained at a peak, but many flying sites were lost due to noise or housing developments; however, these dedicated men flew wherever, and whenever, an opportunity was present.


In 1951, when radio control came into existence, there emerged a new problem of locating flying areas which

required a rather different type of site than did its predecessor, control line. During the ensuing years, flying sites were discovered, but were lost shortly thereafter due primarily to land and housing developments.

One autumn Sunday, Mike Nogy informed the club president, Francis Barch, that he had located a beautiful field which was very flat, contained about six acres, and was free of obstacles. Upon making an inquiry the club discovered the property to be part of Westmoreland County's Cedar Creek Park in Rostraver Township, Pennsylvania. In October, 1967, Francis Barch, Henry Holesapple, and Nichael Nogy

requested a meeting with the Park Commission. Permission was granted and a meeting was arranged by County Assessor Andrew Kritsky with Recrea-tion Commission members Al Shrump, W. E. Noel, Arthur Wilson, Mike Siyak. W. E. Noel, Arthur Wilson, Mike Sivak, Francis Murrman, and John Laudadio. During this meeting, the club's representatives explained their activities and discussed the role they would assume should the club be granted permission to use the field. Since no member on the Commission had any knowledge of radio control flying, they suggested that a demonstration be staged so that they could better understand the club's activities, and November 20, that 1967 was established as Demonstration Day.

The Mon-Valley club members were somewhat apprehensive of flying in November due to the severity and uncertainty of weather conditions at that time of the year, but their fears

were unfounded as the day dawned sunny and beautiful. The Recreation Commission, composed of Kriksky, Sivak, Murrman, Laudadio, and Shrump were on hand to witness the demonstra-tion. These men were not only inter-ested but also highly impressed as they experienced the majesty of radio con-trol flying for the first time.

As a result, the club members were invited to attend the January 10th Commissioners' meeting to further discuss the possibility of using the property. During this meeting Keith Ackman, club secretary, and Francis Barch, president, presented and explained flying rules and safety precautions to be observed by all flyers. Their efforts bore fruition at this meeting since the club was authorized to use the land. Needless to say, the A.M.A. insurance Needless to say, the A.M.A. insurance program, complete, revised club by-laws, and adequate flying safety rules,

placed them in a somewhat favoral position.

It is appropriate to consider dynamic leadership of the Westmonland County Recreation Commission land County Recreation Commissic before continuing with this story. I 1964, Rostraver Township acquire land for a park. Mr. Andrew Kritsky was responsible for negotiating with th township and local land owners for acquisition of property. This Count: Park Program is included under Federa "project 70" and the park itself is titled Cedar Creek Cedar Creek

Of paramount importance is the fact that the Mon-Valley Radio Control Clut has not only been authorized to use the land, but has also been included in federal "project 70" as a recognized recreational activity. The word "recognized" is very important to us as it should be to radio control enthusiasts everywhere since it placed model aviation in its PROPER perspective.


In a recent interview with Mr. Kriksky, it was determined that the future club flying site will include an asphalt runway, an enclosed pavillion, a parking area, and many other facilities. Mr. Kriksky quoted the cost of this project to be approximately \$60,000 which will include a road to the field as part of the total cost. Of paramount importance is the fact

part of the total cost.

As a summation, the Mon-Valley Radio Control Club is the FIRST club in the United States to be considered under "Project 70." Each member of the club, as well as radio control enthusiasts everywhere are deeply indebted to the leadership and foresight of the WESTMORELAND COUNTY PARK
